Chapman River Regional Park Field Trip

Saturday, 31 October | 8.30am-11.30am | Free

Join the Chapman River Friends Group and the City of Greater Geraldton on a guided walk through Chapman River Regional Park, home to more than 300 plants, 123 birds, 22 reptiles and 7 frogs, plus kangaroos and echindas.

Perfect for all age groups, the guided field trip offers a gentle stroll through bushland right in the heart of Geraldton.

Included in the trip:

- Visit a State NRM Project that safeguards endangered flora
- Explore limestone cliff tops, cool groves of river she-oak, sandplains shrubs and banksia heathlands
 - Assist researchers monitor aquatic biodiversity
 - Discuss how collaboration is achieving positive results
 - View the sweeping vistas of the Moresby Range
 - Free morning tea in the park
